Experience a new series of works by Filipino American artist Bren Bataclan, inspired by his own immigration to Daly City, California in 1981. His minimalist, hyper-stylized compositions are immediately accessible to viewers of all ages and backgrounds, even as they convey deeply-felt themes of estrangement and belonging, discovery, and confusion. *Kulap* invites recognition, reflection, and contemplation of what it means to be an immigrant, a citizen, and an evolving human being.

As part of The Greenway's annual rotating Chinese Zodiac exhibition, Puno has created an artwork for Chinatown Park that celebrates the Year of the Dog and honors the collective memory and shared experiences of this community. The interactive installation, inspired by conversations with Chinatown residents, consists of panels of vertically-mounted, spinnable blocks that are engraved with traditional Chinese characters and story excerpts from her interviews. Her goal in creating this artwork is to help different generations connect through storytelling and tradition, embodying the role of the Dog as a harbinger of friendship.

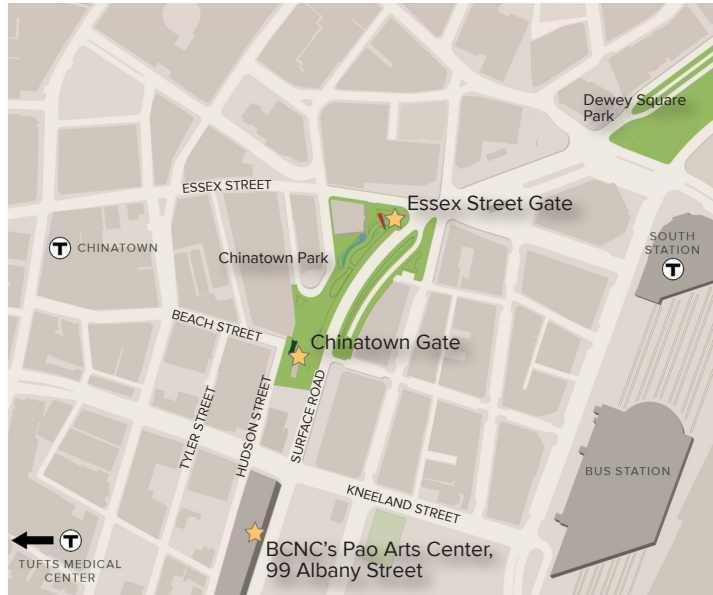
