The Dewey Demonstration Gardens

Thanks to assistance from the State Street Foundation, we have just finished installing our demonstration gardens which have four distinct areas, including:

- Pollinator Garden
- Raised Edible Garden – including a handcrafted demonstration table
- Rain Garden
- Urban Composting Area

The gardens serve as an example of sustainable garden space in the heart of downtown Boston.

The Demonstration Table

With the launch of our 2012 summer season, we're excited to utilize a new demonstration area, featuring an amazing wood table built by students and staff of the North Bennett Street School.

The table is 10 feet by 4 feet and can accommodate an audience of 50 to 75. It is surrounded by our raised edible garden, featuring a variety of vegetables and herbs – raised and cared for by the Conservancy's Green & Grow program.

The table can be used for:

- Demonstrations such as cooking and gardening
- Lectures and talks on gardening, the environment, parks, food, composting or rain gardens.
- An innovative idea that you bring to us.

We are specifically looking for programming on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm when Boston Public Market's Farmers Markets are operating on Dewey Square. (The market season runs from May 24 through November 20th.) We welcome programming opportunities for any day and time as well. Programs must be free and open to the public.
