The Greenway is far more than just a downtown park, whether people are visiting to relax in an urban oasis, experience Public Art, or take part in our free programming that speaks to the moment.

Through innovative activations, organic horticultural practices, and care for its neighboring communities, The Greenway is a premier urban park where visitors can gather, play, unwind, and explore in Downtown Boston.

In 2023, the Conservancy renewed its dedication to enlivening the downtown experience. We continued caring for our gardens and lawns and invited visitors to engage with free programming and Public Art throughout the park. The Conservancy also produced its first-ever dance festival in partnership with presenting sponsor Amazon, *Momentum Greenway Dance Series*, bringing four local dance companies to The Greenway to perform site-specific pieces. Through everything we accomplished this year, we continued to invite Boston to reconsider and reimagine its sense of self as a city.





Greenway Conservancy Volunteer



Dear Friends,

The year 2023 was an incredibly exciting time for the Rose Kennedy Greenway and the communities it serves. The organization experienced a dynamic period, marked by the renewal of its public-private partnership with the Massachusetts Department of Transportation, the City of Boston, and the Greenway Business Improvement District (BID). The Greenway BID unanimously voted for another five-year term, acknowledging The Greenway's significance to Boston's identity and its role in fostering regional opportunities.

The Greenway continued to be a catalyst for arts and culture in Boston. Noteworthy initiatives included a \$1.2 million lighting upgrade in Chinatown parks, enhancing safety and enabling extended programming—a crucial response to urban heat in Chinatown stemming from the climate crisis. The Greenway remained a hub for arts and culture, hosting the *Momentum Greenway Dance Series* and revitalizing the iconic Dewey Square mural through a three-month projection project. The *Roxbury Sunflower Project* showcased ten varieties of sunflowers and inspirational quotes, adding vibrancy to the landscape.

As our board transitions to new leadership, we remain grateful to our community of supporters who enable The Greenway to connect people and neighborhoods through culturally relevant public art, inventive programming, and ecological plant care. Thank you for the privilege of stewarding this vibrant, welcoming green space in the heart of our city.

Caring for The Greenway

Our landscape management program is guided by the ecology of our park. We are dedicated to the practice of ecological horticulture to create and maintain resilient landscapes that connect people to nature and each other.





Maintenance & Improvements

Maintenance and Capital Projects teams performed and supervised repairs and improvements throughout The Greenway, working with pandemic safety protocols as required. Improvements included resealing of joints in pavers in several areas in the fountains and walkways in the North End, fabricating new air circulation louver assemblies with water-tight covers in Rings Fountain, and the installation of new park lighting in Chin Park. Maintenance and Capital Projects staff also worked together to maintain the Greenway Carousel at Tiffany & Co. Foundation Grove to a very high level with no days of operation missed due to mechanical downtime.

Caring for The Greenway

Ecological Horticulture

The Conservancy continued to enhance The Greenway's gardens and landscapes by using ecological horticulture management and intentional design applications. 2023 saw many horticultural initiatives, including new tree installations, advocating for native bees, administering compost tea, and participating in No Mow May that promotes sustainability.


















In addition, the irrigation system was updated during the summer months, and we continued to plant the Dewey Demonstration Gardens with vegetables and maintain a rain garden. The weekly volunteer engagements that helped maintain the gardens and landscape proved to be extremely valuable and supported the department. These practices continue to help us create and maintain resilient landscapes that provide vital open green spaces for the community and visitors, and benefit the environment and natural ecosystem.














Rangers

Throughout 2023, our privately funded Park Rangers provided security and ambassadorship on The Greenway. The Rangers also successfully partnered with a security company who provided overnight unarmed patrols of The Greenway resulting in very noticeable increased safety and security in the park.

Volunteers

The Greenway has continued to offer robust volunteer programming to local organizations, corporate and community groups, and individuals. The Greenway Conservancy continued to offer a variety of volunteer opportunities ranging from Horticulture and Maintenance projects, to assisting in the five-week *Momentum Greenway Dance Series*. In 2023, over 760 volunteers contributed over 3,357 hours to the beautification of The Greenway and its programming. The dedication and commitment of returning and regular volunteers to The Greenway ensured the success of The Greenway's unique organic horticulture design.

Public Art

Through site-specific art commissions that are closely tied to the land that is now The Greenway, the Conservancy is committed to amplifying non-dominant stories that resonate with all of our visitors.

The 2023 season of Public Art on The Greenway intentionally cultivated spaces of care, belonging, and joy for diverse communities. Commissions included *Gateway To Infinity (An Anti-Monument)*, *Year Of The Rabbit, Breathe Life Together*, 2022-2024, *Sound In The City*, and *Love Language*, 2023.

Stretching 40 feet in diameter, *Gateway to Infinity (An Anti-Monument)* is a large-scale groundwork in the North End by Boston-based queer, interdisciplinary artist Maria Molteni which responds to colonial histories and their monuments.

Roxbury Sunflower Project: Seeds of Wisdom

Over 5,000 sunflowers were planted in three installations throughout the park as part of artist Ekua Holmes' *Roxbury Sunflower Project: Seeds of Wisdom.*Project collaborators included The Greenway's horticulture team, long-term Greenway volunteers, United Neighbors of Lower Roxbury Community Gardens, Friends of Martin's Park, Hurst Landscaping, PowerCorpsBoston (a City of Boston program), and Madison Park Development Corporation.

Year Of The Rabbit

For 2023's annual Chinatown zodiac project, the Greenway Conservancy Public Art team collaborated with the Metropolitan Area Planning Council, Chinatown Land Trust, Pao Arts Center, ACDC, and the City of Boston to develop a Chinatown Cultural Plan as an addendum to the Chinatown Masterplan from 2020. The Cultural Plan will be launched in June 2024.



Little Amal

As the first stop on her walking tour across the United States, *Little Amal*, a twelve foot puppet of a 10 year old Syrian refugee child, made a procession down The Greenway in early September. The event, which was co-hosted by ArtsEmerson and the City of Boston, included dance and musical performances by several community groups including a bhangra workshop led by the New England Bhangra club and a dragon dance by Wal Lum Academy.

Programs & Community

The Programs department supported and hosted more than 400 free events on The Greenway in 2023, including markets, festivals, fitness classes, and performances.

After a year-long development process, we saw a major initiative come to life, the *Momentum Greenway Dance Series*, presented by Amazon. This free outdoor series consisted of five days of contemporary dance by four companies; Continuum Dance Project, Jean Appolon Expressions, Public Displays of Motion, and Vimoksha Dance Company.

The Greenway Conservancy continued its deep engagement with the Chinatown community, working with key partners and hosting events by new partners including Asian Women for Health and the Greater Boston Chinese Golden Age Center. We also hosted an event to present and celebrate the improvements for a section of Mary Soo Hoo Park, which will provide more recreational and children's space in this busy neighborhood after a year of community feedback sessions.

Consistent with the Conservancy's commitment to supporting local entrepreneurs, The Greenway served as an incubator and platform for more than 100 small businesses through our food truck program, fitness series, and artisan and farmers markets. The majority of these businesses identified as women or minorities.

The Programs department saw an increase in the number of event applications, which demonstrated that The Greenway continues to be a sought after destination as downtown Boston continues to rebound from the impacts of the pandemic. Our programmatic season extended into winter with pilot activations such as a winter sauna village, performance series, and market pop-up that we hope to build upon for 2024.

Financials

A record-breaking year for philanthropy provided funding that allowed for additional programming park-wide. Generous support from our foundation and corporate partners, as well as The Greenway Business Improvement District, provided for expanded public art, winter activations and dance programming, which encouraged community engagement throughout The Greenway.

While still popular, The Greenway's most important sources of earned income, the carousel and beer garden, were negatively impacted by the summer and fall's unusually poor weather.

The Greenway Business Improvement District (BID), the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT), and City of Boston (City) support were consistent with their landmark 2017 multi-party funding agreement. In 2023 the four parties, (including The Greenway), successfully finalized the extension of these funding agreements through FY28. The BID will begin the next five years by providing \$1.1M annually for maintenance and horticulture operations, plus \$0.5M for enhancements. The City's annual funding fluctuates with the performance of an invested trust fund. MassDOT will fund maintenance, horticulture, and capital repairs, as well as provide in-kind support.

Core costs remained relatively stable compared to 2022 with minor payroll related increases reflecting a full year of 2022 hires. Growth in direct costs was fully funded and covered programs such as the *Momentum Greenway Dance Program*, increases in public art and public art programming, and our continuing work with the Chinatown community.

In keeping with our investment policy, the Conservancy drew from the endowment at a Board-approved 4.5% sustainable rate to fund current operations. 2023 marked the first full year with our newly adopted investment managers, which when combined with favorable market conditions, resulted in substantial gains in our net assets compared to 2022.
